Payment Reform By the Numbers

7% the annual increase in health care costs anticipated by employers next year

>90% the amount of health care payments that are fee-for-service today

1-15% the potential range of savings for employers from replacing FFS with value-oriented payment models for specific services or populations

1-3% the proportion of payments today that are tied to performance

20% By 2020, the proportion of payments CPR is aiming to have tied to performance or designed to cut waste

The costs of health care continue to rise at an unsustainable rate with limited to no indication of commensurate improvements in quality. Our current health care payment system—paying for volume—does little to enhance the value of the care we buy. No one feels the sting of this current system more than those who use and pay for care. Now, with costs at an all-time high, the passage of the Affordable Care Act, and a struggling economy, we have a historical window of opportunity to change how we pay for care in this country.

Catalyst for Payment Reform (CPR) was created to shine light on the urgency for payment reform and to work toward a system in which payments to doctors and hospitals reflect the value of the care they provide—not just the volume. Recent health reform legislation begins to address this for Medicare. CPR stepped in to provide thought leadership to large private and public-sector purchasers of health care outside of Medicare. The only nationwide purchaser coalition focused on payment reform, CPR helps purchasers identify the greatest opportunities for payment reform, send powerful, uniform signals to the market about their shared agenda, and implement change in collaboration with their contracted health plans.

- Enhance your leverage with health plans by working with other purchasers—
 implement a shared purchaser agenda by using consistent sourcing tools, like
 standard RFI questions and contract language, and participate in CPR moderated
 health plan user groups, to accelerate the implementation of payment reforms;
