
Ongoing provider consolidation accelerated by COVID-19 means purchasers will likely have less market power to combat high and rising prices.

In the first Report Card since 2017, CPR and the Source on Healthcare Price and Competition at UC Hastings College of the Law are shining a spotlight on state efforts to help consumers readily find health care price information.

Given that legislation and the development of transparency websites takes time, we hoped a hiatus in releasing Report Cards would give states time to progress - we were not wrong! This year, 16 states got passing grades.
